### Keep on Reading!

Did you know when you read aloud to your child you are laying the groundwork for future reading success? Through read-alouds, children are hearing rhyme, rhythm, and exciting new words. Children also begin to learn that print and symbols (the alphabet) have meaning. An added bonus is that reading together can be a special time shared between you and your child. I would encourage you to read to your child daily and share in a variety of books, although there are also benefits to reading the same picture book over and over again. Children enjoy hearing the same text time and time again, and as they do, their comprehension grows, their vocabulary increases, and they become more aware of language patterns. That being said, keep on reading to your little bookworms at home.
